



PHASES OF EARTHQUAKE DRILL

REMINDERS TO FOLLOW DURING THE DRILL



PHASE 1. ALARM

During the drill, the 1-minute alarm by the ambulance siren and buzzer indicates an earthquake or shaking.





PHASE 2. RESPONSE

While the alarm is going on, do the following:

- DUCK, COVER & HOLD
- Watch out for falling objects
- Keep calm and don't panic
- Remain in this position until the “shaking” stops





PHASE 3. EVACUATION

As soon as the “shaking” stops, check your classmates in the classroom/colleagues in the office, immediately evacuate the school premises, and **proceed to the Eyeb Grounds** applying the **“BUDDY-BUDDY System”** using the safe exit routes.

DO NOT STROLL; avoid making unnecessary noise.

NO PUSHING & RUNNING while passing the exit routes.



PHASE 4. ASSEMBLY

At the Eyeb Grounds, students, staff, and faculty must be grouped according to their department or the unit, or whichever is applicable; everyone must be accounted for by the unit head and instructor through a headcount and to monitor injuries.

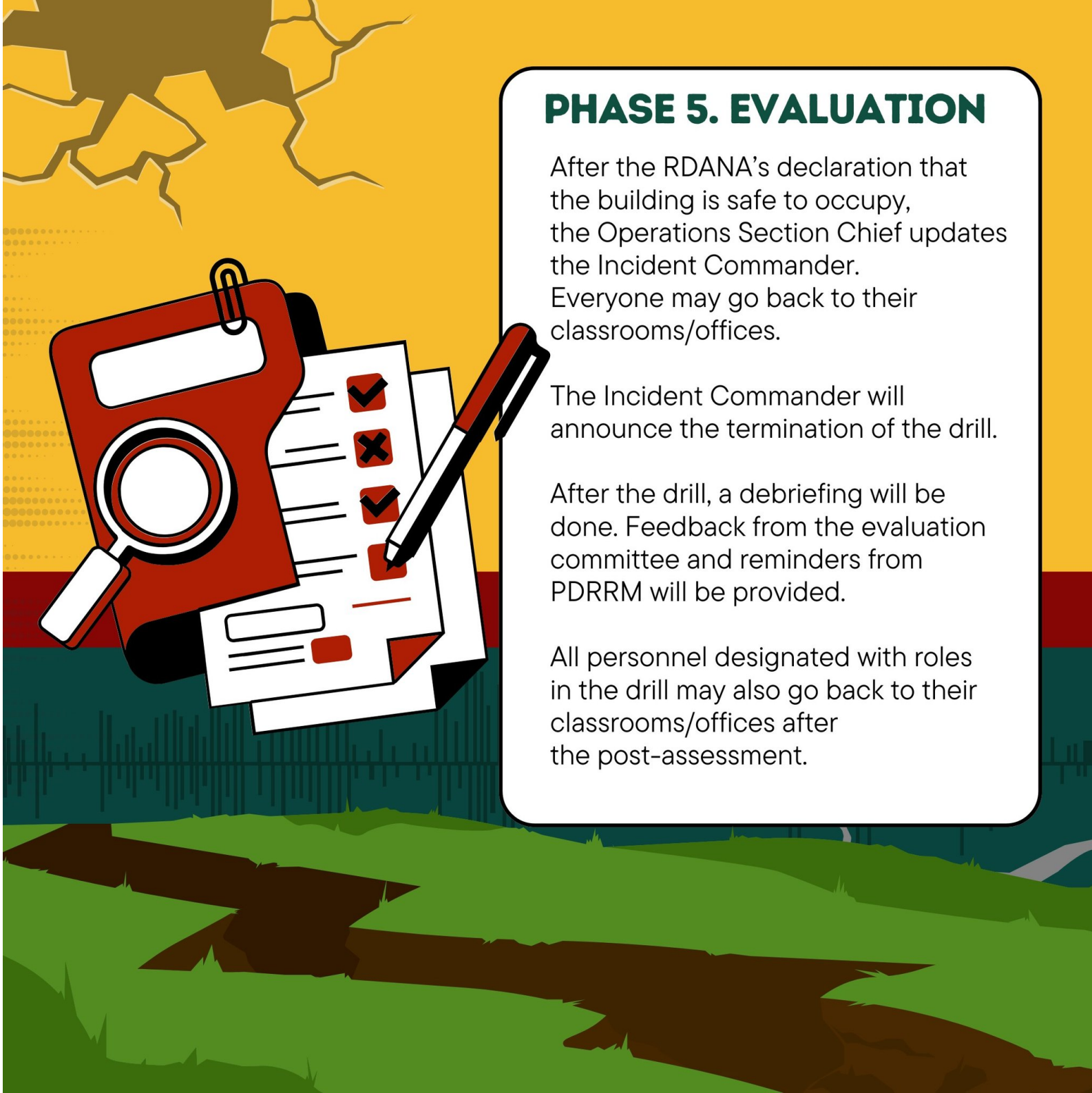
Communicate your group status to Dr. Edgar Mapangdol (Operations Section Chief).

The Operations Section Chief will acknowledge the status report and provide updates to Dr. Arel B. Sia-ed (Incident Commander).

If all are accounted for, the Incident Commander signals the Operation Section Chief to activate the Rapid Damage Assessment and Needs Analysis (RDNA-Engineering Office) to check the structural condition of the building/offices. Search, Rescue and Retrieval will be activated also to address reported casualties.

The Incident Commander updates the designated Emergency Operations Manager, Dr. Geraldine L. Madjaco, regarding the status of the drill.





PHASE 5. EVALUATION

After the RDANA's declaration that the building is safe to occupy, the Operations Section Chief updates the Incident Commander. Everyone may go back to their classrooms/offices.

The Incident Commander will announce the termination of the drill.

After the drill, a debriefing will be done. Feedback from the evaluation committee and reminders from PDRRM will be provided.

All personnel designated with roles in the drill may also go back to their classrooms/offices after the post-assessment.
